

Robin Stone and John Savage's music relationship dates back to 1973 when Stone (who was 13 at the time and lived up the street on White Street in Waterville, NY) was walking from his house down to the local village 5 and dime and saw Savage picking on an electric guitar in his driveway. Fast forward a few weeks and they were putting together their first band. Early acts included Five Finger Discount and Shotgun and the boys played Junior High and High School Dances while in High School. After graduating High School they continued their musical partnership and were the "House Duo" jamming late into the wee hours of the morning at the infamous Bad Boys house, farmhouse on Rt 12 just south of Waterville that Savage and his friends sublet from Hamilton College students during the summer of 1981.

After spending a year at University of Miami FL Savage came back to Waterville NY and he and Stone launched their duo Savage Stone. Featuring Savage on an Ovation acoustic guitar and Stone on a Fender Rhoads, they became local fan favorites. Eventually reuniting with high school drummer Ray Barnes, the trio became a sought after CNY party band playing numerous weddings and parties. Their rehearsals in the Village of Waterville in a room rented above a retail shop hosted weeknight parties including kegs of beer on occasion.

Savage Stone eventually added bass player Carter Jackson, Lead Guitarist Ed Byron and a few different drummers playing clubs and parties throughout Central NY.

After Savage Stone Robin continued his musical career performing with CNY Bands Rolling Easy, What About Bob, and Albany Area rock band Vegas Crush among others opening for National Acts Orleans, Sweet and Grass Roots as well as main stage performances at the Oswego Harborfest.
